Why an Emergency Preparedness Solution Makes Sense

Recent natural disasters, including hurricanes, floods, and wildfires, have had a massive effect on businesses and communities. According to research company Aon, the last two years combined represent the costliest weather-related period in U.S. history, totaling over \$650 billion. (Aon, Weather, Climate & Catastrophe Insight – 2018 Insight Report)

Also on the rise in recent years has been man-made disasters such as active shooters, workplace violence, terrorism, and cyberattacks. According to information from Ponemon Institute's 2018 Cost of a Data Breach study for IBM, the cost of the average data breach to a U.S. company is \$7.91 million.

While both natural and man-made disasters as well as other emergencies can obviously be quite costly to corporations and other organizations, it's important to remember that the faster and more decisively you can respond to an emergency, the more you will be able to protect lives, mitigate the cost to property, and minimize financial loss and damage to brand reputation.

Situational awareness is central to faster and more decisive response, and that's where emergency preparedness solutions play a key role. An effective emergency preparedness solution allows organizations of all sizes to maintain awareness of actual or potential incidents, and to respond effectively and recover quickly.




Features of an Effective Emergency Preparedness Solution

An emergency preparedness solution allows organizations or corporate enterprises to be more aware of situations that may have a damaging effect on operations. That awareness allows you to respond quickly and more effectively, to maintain operational continuity, and speed recovery.

Some of the benefits of an emergency preparedness solution include:

- A view of company and state-level information – a common operating picture – providing a full view of day-to-day incidences and occurrences as well as organization-wide summaries
- An accurate status and visibility of surrounding local government and businesses to better determine the impact to your organization and employees
- Awareness of incidents occurring in your geographic area, allowing advance preparation for emergencies
- The ability to quickly identify needs and allocate resources appropriately when an emergency occurs
- Standardization of communication efforts with employees, partners, and other stakeholders





When considering a emergency preparedness solution, look for these features and components to provide the cornerstone of an effective solution for your business or organization:

Event Reporting – Allows you to organize and keep track of all events or incidents within your organization on a day-to-day basis, and especially when emergencies occur. You should be able to track event details, status, priority, contact information, name and position of those reporting, and area maps, and also to generate comprehensive reports with all status information about an incident.

Resource Requests / Task Assignments – This feature gives you the ability to submit, assign, and track missions, resource and task requests during an incident. Key personnel can then dispatch resources needed to respond to a specific incident while maintaining a common operating picture. This should be able to match your current organizational process, not require you to adapt your process to meet the solution.

Situation Reporting (SITREPs) – Gives your organization situational awareness and a common operating picture, which allows strategic management decision capability for leaders, decision makers, and other stakeholders during an emergency. An effective emergency preparedness solution should also have the capability to generate daily reports and leadership briefings, so that published reports can be viewed and tracked regularly.

Team Tracking / Status – Leverage the ability to communicate immediately and effectively to inform and provide direction to employees and teams. An important component of an effective platform is to have integrated web and mobile applications that allow details and assignments to be communicated and managed in real time as situations unfold.

Maps – Visualize crisis information data and activities on a map to make better decisions during an emergency. Geographic Information System (GIS) mapping capabilities should include tools necessary to create a dynamic, geographically-based common operating picture through an intuitive interface. Maps should be able to display information from the system as well as external data feeds using standard GIS data formats.

Dashboards – Organize and summarize critical information quickly and efficiently, in an easily viewable format, so that information can be easily provided to the right people in the right positions at the right time – enabling a prompt, well organized, and effective response to an incident. The dashboard should provide information about current, active incidents, identify the type of emergency, and supply a means to communicate details to all relevant stakeholders.

Data Exchange – Exchange information, data, and resources with other organizations and stakeholders across public and private sectors, including Emergency Management, Police, and Fire Departments. This capability creates greater opportunities for collaboration in response to an emergency, leading to a more rapid response and recovery.

These are just some of the main components that would make your emergency preparedness solution effective. Ideally, the solution you use could be scaled and configured to meet your organization's unique needs and workflows.
